



Guidelines for Use of the Foundation's Logo

For National Program Offices of Scholars/Fellows Programs

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) no longer supports the use of individual logos for national programs and, instead, encourages the use of the Foundation's logo with appropriate support language. To ensure that the relationship between RWJF and its national programs is properly represented, we have issued the following guidelines for the use of our logo. Use these guidelines in your communications products and follow them until your grant ends. Use of the Foundation's logo and support language on grant-related documents *after* your grant closes will be discussed at an appropriate time.

National Programs

National programs may use the Foundation's logo—which should be reproduced in either black or PMS Warm Grey 11 (or its equivalent)—only in conjunction with the approved support statement set forth below. Both the logo and support statement should be used in all program-related products, such as stationery, news releases, reports, briefs, Web sites and advertisements.

- “<Program Name> is a national program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, with direction and technical assistance provided by <external organization>.”

We have also implemented RWJF Visual Identity Guidelines that include the correct use of graphic treatments, colors and fonts. As our national programs are an extension of the Foundation, these guidelines should be followed for specific products such as stationery and calls for proposals, as well as signage and presentations. As you develop other materials for your program, it may be appropriate to extend the visual guidelines to these products as well. You should discuss these issues with RWJF's design manager, Joan Barlow, who will provide direction and assistance in using the RWJF Visual Identity Guidelines.

Scholars and Fellows under National Programs

While it is appropriate for national programs to use the Foundation's logo, scholars and fellows may *not* use the Foundation's logo and should use the following support statements as appropriate:

- “<John Doe> is a 200X Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Community Health Leader.”
- “Support for this <project, Web site, publication, conference, etc.> was provided by a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Community Health Leaders program.”
